




Objectives:

SuSanA has many supporters!



Moreover, the SEI Initiative on Sustainable Sanitation has been commissioned by SIDA for 2015 to 2019 with a budget of 265 T EUR per year for 2015 & 2016, with activities that include SuSanA, The SuSanA community does influence the BMGF spending which is 75 million Euro per year (2010-2015) on sanitation.
