Regional scope and partner countries:

Cambodia

- Phase I: 10 model schools
- II: Scale up in Kampot province and in other provinces through NGO partners (over 500 schools)

Lao PDR

- Phase I: 22 model schools; Scale up in Vientiane Capital
- Phase II: national scale-up (Over 220 schools across Lao) plus support from NGO partners

Philippines

- Program implemented by DepED in over 7,000 schools
- Bilateral ARMM Fit for School program

Indonesia (West Java)

- Phase I: 10 model schools
- II: Scale up in Bandung/ West Java

WASHaLOT

2013, Fit for School developed prefabricated group washing facility:

- 22 Children can use at same time
- Low cost (85 100 USD)
- Reduced water consumption to 120ml for handwashing
- Universally available and durable galvanized iron pipes
- Attached bucket for functionality, if no pipe water available
- Encourage School Community to get involved in installation and enhancements



All schools should reach Basic WASH Services by 2030

Basic drinking water

Drinking water from an improved source is available at the school

Basic sanitation

Improved facilities, which are single-sex and usable (accessible, functional, private) at the school

Basic handwashing

Handwashing facility with water and soap at the school
