World trend of urbanisation

- In June 2015 world population was 7.3 billion
- 60% (4.4 billion) population lives in Asia
- China (1.4 billion) and India (1.3 billion) remain the two largest countries of the world
- S. Asian urbanisation between 2014 and 2050: India (32% to 50%), Bangladesh (34% to 56%) and Pakistan (38% to 57%)

- 68,000+ children die every year from diarrhoea
- 44% of the pop. still following open defecate







Figure 2.3: Status of Girls Toilet in Schools

- 1.3 Million Schools are there in India
- Primary schools
 - 2000-01 + 2013-14 (638,738)(858, 916)
- **Upper Primary schools** 2000-01 → 2013-14
 - (589,796)(206, 269)
- 98% of the rural habitants have a primary school within 1km distance







National School Sanitation Initiative

- In 2011, baseline survey was conducted in 41 schools n over 32000 students covered
- ESF was appointed as Knowledge Partner by GIZ, MoHRD and CBSE (2012)
- Responsible for Hardware as well as software implementation
- Prepared detailed School Action Plan in 47 schools in 5 respective cities
- E-learning materials were developed for schools
- Developed Online Rating System & a school sanitation portal <u>http://www.schoolsanitation.com</u> created
